

Land Invertebrates

Survey

The Survey was undertaken throughout the month of July 2019. Local residents contributed observations they had made in their gardens as part of an organised Garden Survey. Additional observations from earlier in the same year and in the autumn of 2018 were also taken into account.

Survey Summary:

The survey of Land Snails on the 'Darshill Spring Site' was made in conjunction with the first 'Water Invertebrates River Dip Survey' in October 2018, at the start of the Land Invertebrates Survey. Nothing unusual was recorded in 2019:

- Woodlice and Earwigs were found in each garden
- Along with the other invertebrates, a balance of Ants, Slugs, Centipedes and Millipedes, were noticed
